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Abraham Lincoln's 1863 Thanksgiving Proclamation by Barb Nicolls



Though celebrated before 1863, Thanksgiving was not a national holiday until Abraham Lincoln proclaimed it as such on October 3 in the midst of the Civil War. Sarah Josepha Hale, editor of Godey's Lady's Book from 1837 to 1877, is given credit for influencing Lincoln by writing him that the "day of our annual Thanksgiving [should be] made a National and fixed Union Festival" and by campaigning for the holiday's official recognition in the pages of her magazine. However, it appears the Civil War had more to do with the creation of this national holiday than Sarah Hale and Godey's, which pointedly avoided serious political issues and never mentioned the war.

A letter from one of Lincoln's secretaries John Nicoly dated Apr. 1, 1864 states that the proclamation was actually written by Secretary of State William H. Seward and was in his handwriting. The original manuscript was sold a year later to benefit Union troops and has never resurfaced. The proclamation appeared in full on page 1 of the Sunday, Oct. 4, 1863 edition of The New York Times:

A PROCLAMATION BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

The year that is drawing towards its close has been filled with the blessings of fruitful fields and healthful skies. To these bounties, which are so constantly enjoyed that we are prone to forget the Source from which they come, others have been added, which are of so extraordinary a nature that they cannot fail to penetrate and soften even the heart which is habitually insensible to the ever-watchful providence of Almighty God. In the midst of a civil war of unequaled magnitude and severity, which has sometimes seemed to invite and provoke the aggressions of foreign States, peace has been preserved with all nations, order has been maintained, the laws have been respected and obeyed, and harmony has prevailed everywhere except in the theatre of military conflict, while that theatre has been greatly contracted by the advancing armies and navies of the Union. The needful diversion of wealth and strength from the fields of peaceful industry to the national defense have not arrested the plow, the shuttle or the ship. The ax has enlarged the borders of our settlements, and the mines, as well of iron and coal as of the precious metals, have yielded even more abundantly than heretofore. Population has steadily increased, notwithstanding the waste that has been made in the camp, the siege and the battle-field; and the country, rejoicing in the consciousness of augmented strength and vigor, is permitted to expect continuance of years with large increase of freedom.

No human counsel hath devised, nor hath any mortal hand worked out these great things. They are the gracious gifts of the Most High God, who, while dealing with us in anger for our sins, hath nevertheless remembered mercy.

It has seemed to me fit and proper that they should be solemnly, reverently and gratefully acknowledged, as with one heart and voice, by the whole American people. I do, therefore, invite my fellow citizens in every part of the United States, and also those who are at sea, and those who are sojourning in foreign lands, to set apart and observe the last Thursday of November next as a day of thanksgiving and prayer to our beneficent Father, who dwelleth in the heavens. And I recommend to them that, while offering up the ascriptions justly due to Him for such singular deliverances and blessings, they do also with humble penitence for our national perverseness and disobedience commend to His tender care all those who have become widows, orphans, mourners, or sufferers in the lamentable civil strife in which we are unavoidably engaged, and fervently implore the interposition of the Almighty hand to heal the wounds of the nation, and to restore it as soon as may be consistent with the divine purposes, to the full enjoyment of peace, harmony, tranquility and union.

In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and caused the seal of the United States to be affixed.

Done at the City of Washington, this third day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and of the Independence of the United States the eighty-eighth.
