Nicolls Field, November 30, 2013, New Castle, PA

Not since Turkey Bowl IV in 1971 had the Turkey Bowl seen so much snow. 1971 was the first year that the Turkey Bowl was played on Nicolls Field. Inspired by the 1950 Snow Bowl and the 1971 Snow Bowl, sixteen players took the field for Turkey Bowl XXXI despite the cold and deep snow. The starting offense for the Young Bucks was Jamm'n Jake Grover, Cody "Bear" Grover, "Bulldog" Jeffrey "Edgerrin" Grover, James Bundy, Jonathan Speedy Bundy, Defender Joel Bundy, Joshua "Attacker Bundy and Alex "The Great" Blucker. The Great" starting defense for the Silver Bucks was "Wild" "Game Nicolls. Bill Breaker" Bruce Nicolls, "Too Small" Dale Nicolls, Greg "Bubby" Bundy, "Cap'n Crunch" Kevin Blucker, Ski'n Ian Nicolls, Jonathan "Illini" Wildt and Jacob "Darter" Bundy.

The Youngs received the opening kickoff and Jonathan Speedy Bundy returned the pigskin all the way to the Silver 2 yard line. As a reward, the Youngs ran a sweep left with *Jonathan Speedy Bundy* who scored the first touchdown of the game. After a failed two point attempt, the Youngs led the Silvers 6 to zip.

"Wild" Bill Nicolls returned the ensuing kickoff to his own 45 yard line, but the Silvers were thwarted in their first drive and were forced to punt. The next two series ended with interceptions as "Cap'n Crunch" Kevin Blucker picked off Young pass and "Edgerrin" James Bundy snagged a Silver aerial and returned it to midfield. After two runs by "Bulldog" Jeffrey Grover and a catch by Joshua "Attacker" Bundy, Jamm'n Jake Grover threw to Jonathan Speedy Bundy at the right cone for Jonathan's second TD. The conversion attempt failed but the Youngs now had a commanding lead of 12-0.

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completing passes to "Too Small" Dale Nicolls and "Cap'n Crunch" Kevin Blucker, Greg "Bubby" Bundy found Jonathan "Illini" Wildt for a Silver touchdown. The half ended with the Youngs leading by the score of 12-6.

E. "Jumping" J. Nicolls provided the half-time entertainment with his bagpipes. The second half began with the Silver offense frozen and having to punt on fifth down. On the first series for the Youngs in the second half, Jonathan "Illini" Wildt picked off a pass at the Silvers 10. The Young defense responded when Joshua "Attacker" Bundy sacked the Silver QB in the South end zone. The Youngs were now ahead 14-6 with the Silvers kicking. Alex "The Great" Blucker returned the free kick to the Silver 45, but the drive stalled like a car in cold weather. On the Silvers' first down, Joshua "Attacker" Bundy appeared to have a pick six, but hon-
