JANUARY 19, LEE'S BIRTHDAY: In Ala., Ark., Fla., Ga., Miss., N. C., S. C., Tenn. and Va.

FEBRUARY 12, LINCOLN'S BIRTHDAY: In Alaska, Calif., Colo., Conn., Del., Ia., Ill., Ind., Kan., Ky., Mich., Minn., Mo., Mont., Neb., Nev., N. J., N. Y., N. Dak., Ohio, Pa., S. Dak., Tenn., Utah, Wash., W. Va., Wyo., and observed by Governor's Proclamation in Mass.

FEBRUARY 22, WASHINGTON'S BIRTHDAY: In all the States, Territories and Possessions.

GOOD FRIDAY: In Conn., Del., Fla., La., Md., Minn., N. J., Pa., Philippines, Porto Rico, Tenn.

APRIL 19, PATRIOT'S DAY: In Me. and Mass.

APRIL 26, CONFEDERATE MEMORIAL DAY: In Alabama, Florida, Georgia and Mississippi.

MAY 10, CONFEDERATE MEMORIAL DAY: In Kentucky and North Carolina.

MAY 30, DECORATION DAY: In all the States and Possessions except Ala., Ark., Fla., Ga., La., Miss., N. Mex., N. C., S. C., Tenn., and Texas.

JUNE 3, JEFFERSON DAVIS'S BIRTHDAY: In Ala., Ark., Fla., Ga., Ky., La., Miss., Tenn., Tex. and Va.

JUNE 14, FLAG DAY: Is widely observed but not a legal holiday.

JULY 4, INDEPENDENCE DAY: In all the States, Territories and Possessions.

SEPTEMBER (First Monday), LABOR DAY. In all the States and Territories except Ala., Wyo., and the Philippines.

OCTOBER 12, COLUMBUS DAY: In Ark., Ariz., Calif., Colo., Conn., Del., Fla., Idaho, Ill., Ind., Kan., Ky., La., Me., Md., Mass., Mich., Mo., Mont., Neb., Nev., N. H., N. J., N. M., N. Y., N. Dak., Ohio, Ore., Pa., R. I., Tex., Utah, Vt., Wash., W. V., also in Porto Rico. In Arkansas and Kansas it does not affect notes or judicial proceedings.

NOVEMBER, GENERAL ELECTION DAY: 1st Tuesday after 1st Monday. In every State and Territory except Alaska, Dist. of Col., Hawaii, Ill., Mass., Miss., Ohio, Philippines and Vt. In Illinois it is a legal holiday in Chicago, Springfield, East St. Louis, Galesburg, Danville, Cairo and Rockford. In Ohio it is a half holiday. In Maine it is a legal holiday only as to the courts, which also close on the State Election Day (biennially 2nd Monday in Sept.).

NOV 11, ARMISTICE DAY: In Ala., Ariz., Ark., Calif., Colo., Fla., Ill., Iowa, La., Mass., Minn., Mo., Mont., Neb., N. J., N. C., N. Dak., Pa., R. I., S. Dak., Tenn., Tex., Vt., Va., and Hawaii. In other States by Governor's Proclamation only.

NOVEMBER, THANKSGIVING DAY: Last Thursday in November. It is observed in all the States, although in some it is not a statutory holiday.

DECEMBER 25, CHRISTMAS DAY: In all the States, Territories and Possessions.

47th Day—318 Days to Follow

about 5 below this morning. Ironed most of day. Had 2 phone calls. Kagh Hart + Francis. We got mail this noon. Dad + I a letter, the rest each a card. All very interesting. He seems to like it so far. I'm glad dud feel a lot better since I got the letter.

Dave passed at Armory this morn. Says any body could there. Ironed until 9 p.m. mended till 11 p.m.

Wednesday, February 17, 1943

48th Day—317 Days to Follow

Snowing this morn, but not quite so cold except for a wind. Betty cleaned up the house. I scrubbed bath room + kitchen floors, and wrote 3 letters. We got a card from Bob today. He was still at D'Hoyes Mon. wish they'd move him on so we know where he'll be. Dad came home about 3:30 + we went in town + he got an overcoat + hat. Brown. (34 + 4) very snappy. Boy + Dad went to Y College game tonight. I sewed + cleaned out a dress.

Jimmy called. Bob's back in D.H. at school.

Thursday, February 18, 1943

49th Day—316 Days to Follow

Sun shining but pretty frosty. Washed the bath-room walls & ceiling down today. Went down to Mother's P.M. I talked to R. Hahn and Blanche Cover, on phone. Went to B.B. Linnery at Boardman. We got beat 53 to 34. (I think so that's that for another year maybe longer!). Came home & had ice cream and cake. Pete came in with us. Betty made a pick-up

up there. I believe from G. arena. Carl Shank.

Friday, February 19, 1943

50th Day—315 Days to Follow

Nice sunshiny day. Washed Bob's & Sara's room. I mended the bath-room & Betty's curtains & put them up. —

Paper hangers came at 8:15. Got our bedroom, hall way + liv. room ceiling + base of the wall on today. Quit at 5:30.

I went ahead + washed woodwork as far as back room. Mildred

Russell came this P.M. Hasn't been here for years. we had a nice visit tho' as there wasn't much I could do anyhow. Washed the curtains after she left, + stratted a pair.

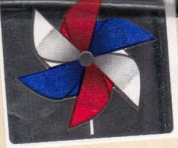

SOME OF the people in high places seem to think that we, the people, need to be scared, worried, nagged into doing our duty. They would make us feel guilty every time we ate a good dinner, had a good night's rest, took time out to attend a movie or a show, in short, behaved like normal folk. I am against that attitude because it is unhealthy, and health is the basis of our fight for victory.

People who are scared, worried, and nagged are troubled in their minds, lose sleep, lose power in their work, become depressed and discouraged. That is no way for a people to fight a war. We must fight with clear heads and high hearts, which means, with contented minds.

Why should not we, who have done our daily stint as well as we can, go to our beds in content? We are asked to pay and we pay. We are asked to give up things we have enjoyed and we yield them cheerfully. We are asked to serve and we serve. We are asked to give our children to the service of our country and we step back and watch them go, hiding our grief. We work, we pay, we give in the spirit of service and we, if we are wise people, take then the word of the Master, the Man of Sorrows and acquainted with grief—Let not your heart be troubled.

Fear Weakens Effort

People who carry fear in their hearts, worry on their minds, burdens of expected woe on their backs, can be in no condition to carry on a fighting spirit against which armed forces can lean hard. To do that we must have an easy conscience and a contented mind. Having done our duty as fully as

humanly possible and stretched even that to its limits, we will not let our hearts be troubled.

The children must not live in and atmosphere of worry and fear. They need to feel the assurance that a contented spirit breathes into the home atmosphere. The men at the front need to feel the thrill of the brave hearts of home behind them. They need to know that we are doing our full duty on the job and have no fear of the outcome. We are not shrinking, we are not afraid. We have faith in their ability to meet the situation and in our own to meet their needs. Meanwhile if we eat well and sleep well and work hard, we shall have the contented mind that is the basis of good health, high courage and clear-headedness.

Scare Headlines

One of the scares tossed at our heads is the scarcity of food, another the scarcity of fuel, another, the scarcity of doctors. Watch out or you'll starve, or freeze or die without medical aid—We know perfectly well that we have enough of everything for use but not a grain of anything to waste, and we are not wasting anything, not even the telephone call for the doctor.

The gist of the matter is this: Let not your heart be troubled. Use your head. Do your day's work and a bit extra. Save everything including your breath. Leave the task of running the war to the leaders, the fighting to the services, the home base job to the workers. Attend to the job that is your own and be content. If everybody attends to his job, nobody need worry and if nobody worries we will be nourished, and warmed, and successful and never mind the doctor.

MOTHERS are hard pressed these days. Every day brings fresh worry of some sort. There is shortage of this and that, the children keep wearing out their clothes and it is difficult to replace them. They fall ill and the doctor is away to camp; they listen to war tales and come home all excited and jumpy. And with all the other troubles that the war has brought these seem too much.

When you feel crowded just stop where you are and sit down, even if you have to have bread and butter and left-over coffee for lunch. Quiet your mind with the thought that although your day is jammed most of the load is unimportant.

Nobody pretends that life is easy these days, nor that there is no cause for worry and grief. There are plenty of such things to wear us down. We cannot send out an army of our youth without shaking us to our foundations, but we can, and we will, stand staunchly on those foundations in home and in community life.

Keep Up the Spirit

Stop long enough to remember that life never has been secure for any of us. Always there have been people suffering, hoping, laboring under great difficulties, and now that it is our turn we can live through it, bravely as they have done. It is the spirit of man that survives every danger, every hardship.

When the water fails and the

plumber is not on hand, when a child falls ill and the doctor is absent, when father discloses that his business is about to close for the duration and he is not certain what to do next, quiet your soul. Remember, "Be still and know that I am God," was a command to you. If you obey it, if you stop where you are and go apart into the quiet of your own soul and stay with it until your mind clears and your faith soars, you will come through the worst in good heart.

One Problem at a Time

There is much to do. Don't try to do it all, nor at one time. Sit down and list the work you think should be done tomorrow. Go over it and cross out anything that will keep for another day. There are many such jobs and you are likely to discover that there was no great necessity for their being done at all. Letters often answer themselves. Problems that involve other people usually solve themselves without your help. List only those tasks that must be done first and your day will be simplified, and you can attend to the things that keep life moving.

Keep the children busy and try to make occasions for laughter in their day, for you and they need it.
