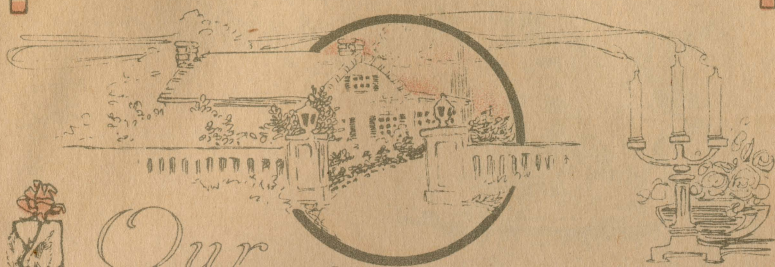




Our Honeymoon

then back home.



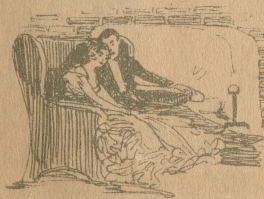

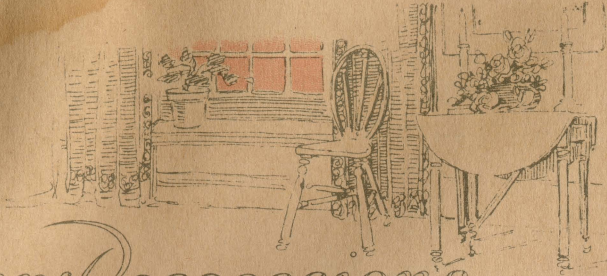


Our Possessions

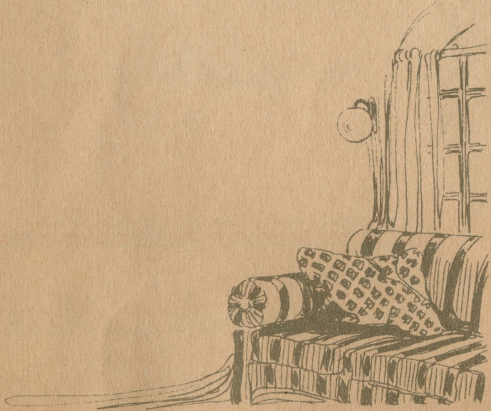
Our first possessions
