



Two plays later **Big Don** showed the old form he had when he wore number 92 for OSU by pulling in a pass from **Jolt'n Jim** for the game's first completion. The Young Bucks' defense responded when free safety **Bubby Bundy** chalked up the second interception of the day.

After the Young Bucks advanced the ball near mid-field Hammerin Hank knew that they were getting impatient for a score. His instincts were right as he took an extra deep drop in his zone and picked off the Young Bucks' pass near the end zone. On the next play Jukin Joey ran the Silvers out of trouble. The idea of someone running on the Youngs' defense ruffled Mad Dog Gary's feathers. On consecutive plays he knifed through the Silver Bucks' line and picked up two sacks. As a result the Silvers were forced to punt for the first time in the game. On defense, Fearless Fred took up the gauntlet glove thrown down by Gary Mad Dog Grover and sacked the Young Buck quarterback two times in a row. In turn the Youngs' were forced to punt for the first time in the game.


Monsterman Mark Hitchins decided it was time to make something happen. He picked off a pass on the first play after the punt and gave the Young Bucks good field position around the fifty yard line. The Youngs' offense wanted to strike quickly.

Big Boy Bob knew the play to call. He faded back and fired a pass over the defense and into the outstretched arms of Too Small Dale in the corner of the end zone. It was just the way Big Boy and Too Small had practiced week after week back in Columbus.

After neither team was able to advance the ball, the Silver Bucks looked like they were starting to hit on all cylinders. Jolt'n Jim completed back to back passes to Dandy Dean and Big Don.

After gaining good field position on a punt, they had the Young Bucks right were they wanted them. *Nifty Neal* picked off a short pass and was headed for the end zone a few short steps away when he was rudely greeted by *Ski'n Ian* who had swooshed in front of him to deny him at the five yard line.

The Silver Bucks had a golden opportunity to score but the Dog Defense had other ideas. Five plays later the Hounding Dog Defense had given up only four yards. The Young Bucks took over on downs thanks to a key tackle for loss by *Bubby Bundy* and a batted pass by *Game Breaker Bruce*. The next four of five series ended with interceptions. *Game Breaker Bruce* picked up the first pick of the second half. *Hammerin Hank* returned the favor with his own interception of a Young pass. *Junkyard Dog Rick Grover* chalked up the next two drive-ending interceptions.

The Young Bucks, needing an offensive strategy change, went to the ground game to work on the clock. Bobby Bubba Smith took the first hand off for a student body left and picked up good yardage. Next Big Boy Bob faked to Ski'n Ian and bootlegged to the right. On fifth down the Youngs continued to run, but this time they ran out of gas and the Silvers took over on downs.



The Silver Buck QB pitched the ball to Quick Kyle who out-quicked the whole dog defense to the corner, turned it up field and ran 40 yards for the Silver's first score. On the extra point the Young defense put up a literal wall across the goal line. The Silver Bucks were not intimidated. They handed the snap off to Jamm'n Jake who hurled his body over the wall for a well deserved point (18-7).

After the game Commissioner Dave Nicolls presented the awards and handed out pins. Everyone who participated in the game received a reward.

Brother, husband, father, grandfather, uncle, and friend. Dave was all of these; but, none of them without adding friend. Dave was always a friend first.

Dave knew a lot of people through his contacts at General Fireproofing and the Ohio State University. Many of these persons became his friends. Alex Shoenenbaum of Shoney's Restaurants, who - through Dave's efforts gave a lot of money to the university, told me that he always considered Dave as his friend. I have attended football games at Ohio Stadium and basketball games in St. John's Arena with Dave. Always, literally, dozens of people yelled "Hello, Dave" or came by to shake his hand. People at the Jazz Arts Group concerts would always stop for a few words. Dave Kennedy, the strength coach for the Buckeyes, recently told me that Dave and Mary were very friendly and helpful when the Kennedys moved to Columbus. These were his friends.

Dave was instrumental in helping Joey Stephan go to Ohio State. He was able to help family members get OSU shirts and caps. Dave followed the moving van into our house when we moved to Columbus. He helped family members obtain football tickets to OSU games. Family members were friends.

Dave was loyal. Loyal to General Fireproofing - his company of thirty years, loyal to the Buckeyes and the university, loyal to his family. Dave missed a lot of the family reunions because of his commitment to the Buckeyes and their bowl games; but, his heart was with the family. Dave told me how glad he was that he could finally join the family reunions again.

Dave - brother, husband, father, grandfather, and uncle - but, most of all, loyal friend. You are missed.
