# Young Bucks Cruise in 18-6 Victory over Silver Bucks

New Castle, PA – It was a crisp fall day in Western Pennsylvania when the Young Bucks and Silver Bucks took the field. The theme for Turkey Bowl XX was "Remembering Turkeys of the Past." Five new players experienced the thrill of entering Nicolls Stadium, hearing the roar of the capacity crowd, running through the banner and down the tunnel of pride made up of former Silver and Young Buck players.

The offenses began the game as cold as the temperature outside. An interception by Stanley "Steamer" Ingison, a sack by Jonathan Speedy **Bundy**, and a breakup of a 5th down pass by Skiin' lan Nicolls highlighted the defensive play on both sides. Then the Young Bucks caught the Silvers off guard by going to a quick snap on 1st down. Jamm'n Jake Grover threw long to Ben "Big" Mack "Attack" for the first TD of the game. The 2 point conversion was unsuccessful so the Youngs were up 6-0. The Silver Bucks offense showed signs of life with a run by **Greg Bubby** Bundy and three straight completions to Hillary "Killer" Nicolls. Janice "Hopalong" Grover and Too Small Dale Nicolls. The Young offense took over on downs and milked the clock by going to the running game with Brad "BDog" Lawrence and Edgerrin James Bundy carrying the pigskin. The half ended when Ben "Big" Mack "Attack" intercepted a Silver aerial.

The Young Buck offense came out of the locker room with some key adjustments. On the fourth play of the half, *Jamm'n Jake Grover* hit *Edgerrin James Bundy* on a crossing pattern for six. The Youngs now had a commanding lead of 12-0. The



defenses for both sides began to dominate. A sack by Defender Joel Bundy, and interceptions by Game Breaker Bruce Nicolls, Ben "Big" Mack "Attack" and Stanley "Steamer" Ingison were the key plays. The last interception was returned by Stanlev "Steamer" to the Young Buck 10 yard line. Three plays later, a scrambling Greg Bubby Bundy found Stanley "Steamer" Ingison in the back of the end zone for the Silver Bucks first score. The score made it a game again, 6-12. The Young Bucks responded three series later when Skiin' Ian Nicolls gave the Youngs good field position with a nice punt return. Jamm'n Jake **Grover** turned a broken play into a touchdown by weaving his way through the Silver defense and stretching the ball over the goal line. The Youngs now had the game in hand 18-

Ben "Big" Mack "Attack" ended the game with his third interception. Jonathan Speedy Bundy, Defender Joel Bundy, Dashing Dasha Dobrova, Brad "BDog" Lawrence, Jeffrey Bulldog Grover and Trevor T-Bone Tingley played key rolls by putting pressure on the Silver quarterback all game. Their counterparts – Wild Bill Nicolls, Hillary "Killer" Nicolls, Gayle
